

and just as much fun in 2024. We missed you on the run, but Activities has more in store!








# **Corvette For Sale**

All SCVCC Members,

The SCVCC By-laws give us the following guidance for the constitution of our Board of Directors:

- Board of Directors and shall number not less than three
- Directors shall be regular members in good standing.
- A Director shall hold office for a term of one year
- Any person qualified to be Director may be nominated by the method of the nomination authorized by the Board
- The Directors shall be elected by written ballot

# **The Easter Cheesecake**

This is always a perenial favorite, originaly contributed by Judy Tomlinson.

#### Ingredients

- 2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 1 cup plus 2 Tbsp. sugar, divided
- 6 Tbsp. butter, melted
- 3 cups (12 oz.) raspberries, divided
- 1 Tbsp. each zest and juice from 1 lemon
- 4 pkg. (8 oz. each) Philadelphia Cream Cheese, softened
- 4 eggs



#### Directions

- 1. HEAT oven to 325°F.
- 2. LINE 13x9-inch pan with foil, with ends of foil extending over sides.
- 3. Combine graham crumbs, 2 Tbsp. sugar and butter; press onto bottom of prepared pan.
- 4. Bake for 10 min.
- 5. RESERVE 1/2 cup raspberries and 1 tsp. lemon zest for later use.
- 6. BEAT cream cheese, lemon juice, remaining zest, and remaining sugar in large bowl with mixer until blended.
- 7. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing on low speed after each just until blended.
- 8. Gently stir in remaining raspberries; pour over crust.
- 9. BAKE 35 to 40 min. or until center is almost set.
- 10. Cool completely. REFRIGERATE 4 hours.
- 11. Top with reserved raspberries and lemon zest. Use foil handles to remove cheesecake from pan before cutting into bars.

# **Bringing Up the Rear**

Just when you think you have heard it all, Honda filed a lawsuit this week against General Motors claiming the design elements of the side intake vent trim on the C8 Corvette—the distinctive trim piece often referred to as the "Boomerang"—violates one of Honda's many design patents.

San Francisco (AP) — Honda Motor Company Ltd. filed a lawsuit against General Motors in California Superior Court in San Francisco this week, claiming the design elements of the side intake vent trim on the 2020 to 2024



C8 Corvette violates the design patent for the taillights on the 2016 to 2021 Honda Civic Sedan. The infringement lawsuit alleges that pursuant to 17 U.S.C. § 411(b)(2), the design is substantially similar to the plaintiff's patented work, and that similarity exists between the overall visual effect.

We know the C8 has been plagued with problems, complications, and setbacks since its release in 2020,



and this is just one more for the list. We also know the C8 has been a significant design shift to our quintessential American sports car, borrowing much of its design inspiration from other iconic brands such as Ferrari, Porsche, Nissan, and even Jeep. But Chevy's desire to make the C8 more appealing to the younger import crowd may have landed them in hot water by borrowing a little too much inspiration from the folks over at Honda.

General Motors offered no response to the lawsuit, stating they don't comment on pending litigation. However, a source inside Chevrolet says the original design was the product of work-for-hire by an outside contractor, and thus the design team was not directly involved with this part of GM's product development.

...While many on the design team expressed doubts as to validity of the suit, in January, Superior Court Judge Doc Hudson, ruled that the plaintiff's claim showed sufficient cause to proceed. Stating, "The Corvette's side intake trim draws clear and distinct similarities to the design elements already in use by Honda". If found to be so, it could be an infringement of Honda's trademark and design patents.

The case is set to go before the court in mid-April, although the court has said it is unlikely it will ever hear the case because the date falls after the April 1<sup>st</sup> deadline for April Fool's Day, and I just made all this crap up. Although, you may never look at a Honda Civic taillight the same again.

But then, that's just my imagination. Scott
